MARRIAGES FOR 1915 FELL BELOW MARK IN 1914.

County Judge D. B. McKnight Wins Over Preachers for Performing Most Ceremonies.

According to figures compiled by County Clerk R. M. Russell, the year 1915 did not prove so lucrative for Dan Cupid as did 1914. During the year just passed there were 236 marriages, while for 1914 there were 283.

Of the marriage ceremonies performed, County Judge D. B. McKnight holds the record with 41 to his credit. Rev. D. H. Leech comes next with 23, Rev. H. Howard Fagan 19, Rev. W. P. White 12, Rev. R. F. Jameson 9, Rev. G. H. Young 10, Rev. F. H. Geselbracht 8, Justice of the Peace L. L. Swan 10, Rev. James Moore 5, Rev. Arthur Lane 5, and a scattering of smaller numbers by other ministers.
