HERE AT HOME.

Medford Mail: Statistics prove that there are more American citizens lynched every year in the United States than have been killed in Mexico in the three years since the revolution began.

The jingoes say that it makes their "blood boil" to hear of an American citizen killed by bandits in a revolution-torn foreign land.

Such are the sentiments of our plutocratic patriots seeking war for selfish profit.
