MOVIE PRICES MAY RAISE AS RESULT OF THE WAR

Admission to local motion picture houses may take a jump some day in the future and join the other houses in the country showing the highest class of pictures by charging 15 cents for evening performances and 10 cents for matinees. Some of Salem's theatres have been charging 15 cents for several weeks, and Sunday all will go on that basis. Some of Eugene's houses are also in the 15 cent class.

The main reason for the raise is given that the price of materials used has gone up so much during the war that an increased rate must be obtained. Carbons, used in the projecting machines, cost about \$35 to \$40 per thousand six months ago. These now cost \$130 per thousand. Raw film material, a German product, has also advanced over 100 per cent, and the price of chemicals, as every local druggist and photographer knows, has gone out of sight, in some cases only a small portion being allowed at a time. Practically every article used in the manufacture is up.

What local managers will do has not been said, although it is known that at least one will raise to a 15 cent basis within the next few weeks and give an excellent service, bigger than ever for the money.
