WAR DEATH RATE

In spite of the immensity of the conflict and the terrible engines of destruction engaged in it, the death list in the present war is at a smaller percentage to the number of men engaged than in any previous great war. But the proportions between deaths in battle and disease have been a little bit more than reversed, compared with our Civil war of half a century ago. Then, for every one who lost his life in battle, five died of disease. Now, for every one who dies of disease, seven are killed in battle. The chances of the soldier being killed outright in the present war are greater than they were in previous conflicts, but the chances for a wounded man's recovery are vastly greater than they ever were before. This is due to the wonderful advances in surgical and medical science, and especially sanitation, in recent years. Far greater care is taken of the soldier's health in the trenches than of the civilian's health in time of peace. Dr. Woods Hutchinson declares that "when we do as well by our civil population in times of peace the health millennium will come."

WHAT THEY THINK.

The New York World recently asked relatives of Lusitania victims how, in their opinion, the long diplomatic deadlock with Germany over the sinking of the liner should be ended. It is a remarkable fact that no correspondent who answered the World's query proposed that the United States should go to war to avenge the deaths of Lusitania victims. One survivor, whose nine-year-old daughter was drowned when the ship went down, saw "too much of the war in England last year" to wish her country to be involved in it. A gentleman who lost a brother writes: "Neither money nor disavowals will bring back the lives that were lost. We are loyal Americans and we are ready to stand by the president in all things." There ought to be an example in the sane repression of these actually bereaved expressions of these actually bereaved hotheads whose counsels would long ago have plunged this country into a war of vengeance had they been heeded.

THE SAME TRUST.

The armor plate trust which now serves arrogant notice on the United States government that it will raise its prices to this country \$200 a ton if the government builds an armor plate plant of its own is the same trust that sold Russia armor for \$249 a ton when it was charging Uncle Sam \$616 a ton for identical plate. It is the same trust which worked off hundreds of tons of defective plate on the United States government, which might have brought defeat to our navy in a decisive battle or caused the death of scores of American sailors in times of peace. Its whole record is consistent with its present threat. It is the acme of selfish, unscrupulous greed, hesitating not at the border line of criminality and treason in its insatiable hunger for exorbitant profits.
