LINN COUNTY HAS TWELVE PROMINENT MINERALS

University of Oregon Issues a Bulletin Giving Particulars of Mineral Resources.

University of Ore., Eugene, Feb. 23.—Of the 89 minerals that Oregon is known to contain, deposits of 12 are found in Linn county. The 12 are as follows: Gold, platinum, garnet, galena, sphalerite, zircon, hermitite, magnetite, chromite, quartz and monazite. The bulletin does not pretend to give a complete list.

Most of the 12 are in the black sand at Foster. The occurrences reported by localities are as follows: Gold—Foster (in black sand). Platinum—Foster. Platinum is used extensively in making laboratory apparatus and jewelry. Ten Oregon counties have deposits of it.

Garnet—Foster (in black sand). Garnet is used for abrasive purposes in finishing wood and leather. Similar crystals are used for gems. Perfect crystals are valuable as museum specimens. Garnet crystals are not uncommon. They occur in 21 of the 35 counties of Oregon.

Galena—on the Santiam. Galena is the ore of lead. At times it contains enough silver to make it a valuable silver ore and gold is often present but the bulletin does not state that this is the case in Linn county. Galena appears in Grant, Baker, Lane, Jackson, Linn and Josephine counties.

Sphalerite—on the Santiam. Sphalerite appears in veins associated with various minerals, especially galena. It occurs also in sedimentary rock as an accessory mineral. It is the ore of zinc. It is found also in the Bohemia district of Lane and Douglas counties and in the Blue River mining district of Lane and in Baker, Jackson, Grant, Josephine and Curry counties.

Zinc—Foster (in black sand). Zinc occurs in sands and gravels. It is found in 18 counties.

Hematite—Foster (in black sand). Hematite is the ore of iron. It is used for manufacturing cheap paint, as a polishing powder and for chalk to mark assay crucibles.

Ilmenite—Foster (in black sand). Ilmenite is used in lining pudding fur-

naces. Large bodies of such ore remain undeveloped in the United States and Canada, due to the difficulty of smelting titanium-bearing iron ores. Ilmenite is found in 20 Oregon counties.

Magnetite—Foster (in black sand). Magnetite is an ore of iron. It is a common occurrence in the black sands of the Pacific Coast, and is also widely distributed through igneous rocks and in ore deposits formed by magmatic segregation.

Chromite—Foster (in black sand). Chromite is the source of the Chromium salts; i. e., potassium chromate, potassium dichromate and lead chromate. It is also used in making hard steel and for making brick to line smelter furnaces.

Quartz—Foster (in black sand). It is used as a rock crystal for optical instruments, for ornamental purposes, with coke to make carborundum, as a sandstone for hones and grinding stones and as a flux in metallurgy.

Monazite—Foster (in black sand). Monazite is the source of thorium from which the Welshbach gas mantle is made.

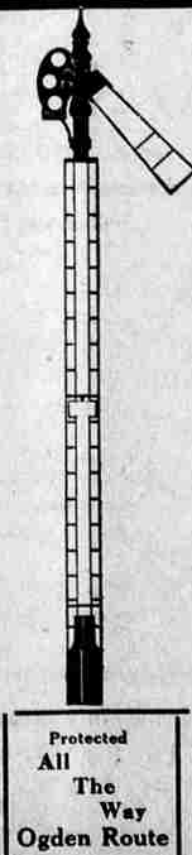
