USED THE NEWSPAPERS.

General Carr, of Durham tobacco fame lays his success to advertising. He recently said:

"When I signed my first advertising contract for \$250,000 I didn't sleep for a week. I thought I was ruined. But the results justified the expenditure, and soon I was spending \$500,000 a year for advertising. The biggest part of it went to the newspaper. I had learned that the newspaper ad is the best in the world. There is no line of business that it does not help."

"I was in the banking business, and I built up as much trade as my two nearest competitors combined by newspaper advertising. My four boys are the biggest hosiery manufacturers in the country, and they have relied on newspaper advertising to make their success. The first thing, of course, is to have the goods, but after that you must make your goods known."

A LOSING GAME.

As an offset to the territorial conquests in Europe which have been made by Germany during the progress of the great war, it is to be noted that all of Germany's colonial possessions have been wrested from her and are now held by her enemies. The last of these to go was the German Kamerun, in Africa, which London dispatches recently announced has been conquered by Franco-British forces after a year's struggle. This was the third largest of Germany's foreign colonies, both in area and population.

The capture of the Kamerun protectorate completes the conquest of the great colonial empire which was built up by Prince Bismarck, against his own better judgment, so it is claimed, but in response to German sentiment credited by the universities.—Ex.
