PROMINENT CHINA MISSIONARY TO LECTURE HERE THURSDAY

Dr. J. H. Blackburn, of Banking China to Talk Twice to Albany People on Orient.

Albany will be visited Thursday by one of the most prominent missionaries in the foreign field when Dr. J. H. Blackburn, of Nanking, China, appears in two addresses. At the Methodist church at 2:30 in the afternoon he will address the Union Women's Missionary meeting on the subject of "The New Woman of China." In the United Presbyterian church at 7:30 p. m. he will give a stereopticon lecture on "The Chinese Revolution and Famines." He has a set of 100 very wonderful and unusual views that are said to be intensely interesting.

Dr. Blackburn has been in China for the past 10 years and has been a keen student of that queer country since taking up his work in the orient. He has the largest institutional church in China and has been doing fine work in a missionary way. During a year's furlough he is lecturing all over the United States in the interest of his work. The public is cordially invited to the evening meeting, no charge for admission being made.
