Some Comparisons About Travelling in Early Days and at the Present Time.

Lebanon, E. A.: G. A. Waggoner made the trip to Albany by train yesterday, and as usual there was a man aboard who thought he had just cause for complaint because the train was not making better time. "You think this is slow traveling, do you?" said Mr. Waggoner, after listening awhile. "Well, I wonder what you would have done in the days when walking was good. I walked from Portland to the foothills above Brownsville in 1852 when only ten years old. I made the trip from Brownsville to Portland, for supplies, by ox team when a lad of 15, when it took two weeks to come and go. I have made the trip from Lebanon to Albany when it took nearly three hours hard jolting in a stage

coach, and was glad to pay a dollar for the privilege. Today we make the journey in a comfortable car in forty minutes for 35 cents fare, and the only disagreeable feature is meeting some on who thinks he is not traveling fast enough." The present day traveler had nothing more to say on the subject of slow trains.

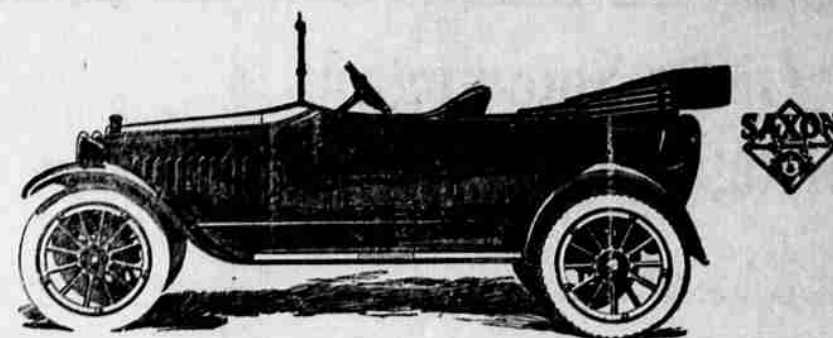
