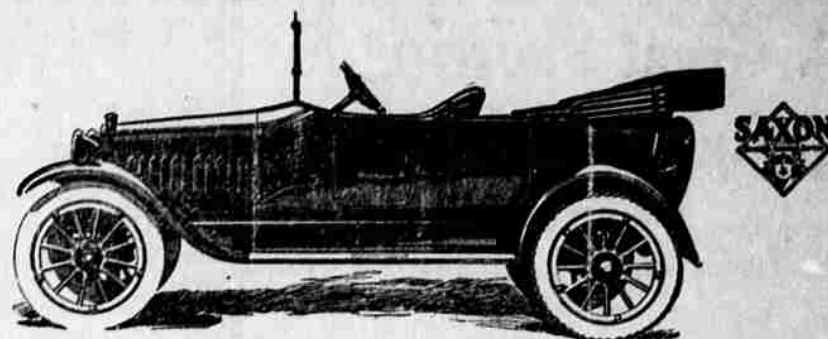
POMONA GRANGE MET WITH HARMONY GRANGE

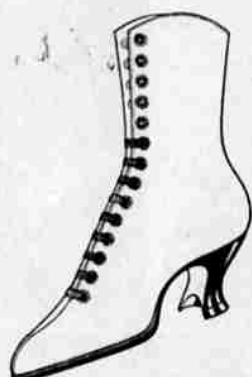
