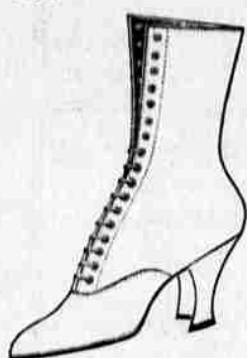

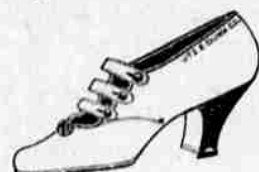

Resolved, that we deeply and sincerely sympathize with the widow and the entire family of the deceased brother.

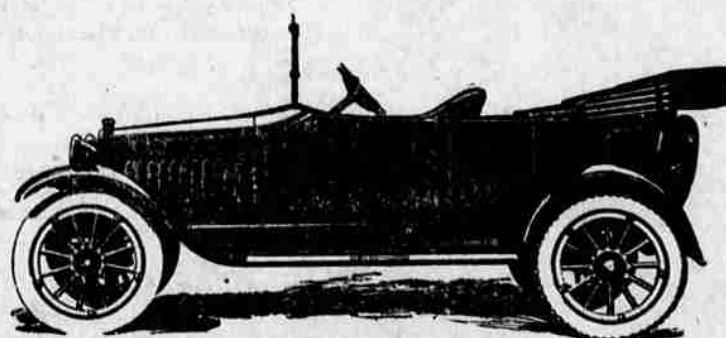
Resolved, That a page in our record be dedicated to his memory.

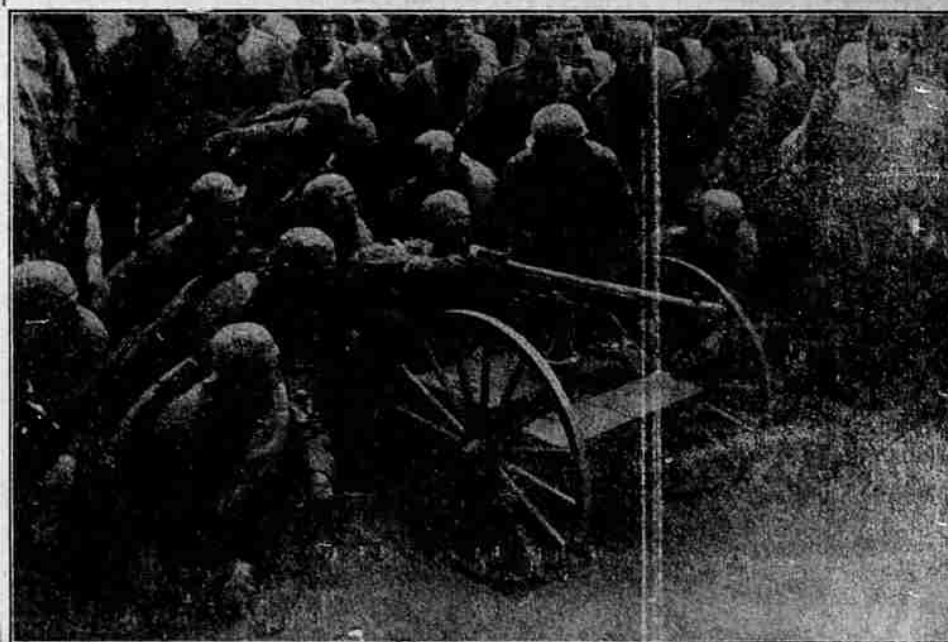
