TRAIN FOR MARRIAGE.

Ida Tarbell writes an interesting article entitled "Give the Girl a Chance," in which she asks why a girl should not be trained for what she will most probably do in the world.

"Of every one hundred American girls who live to be twenty-five years old eighty-seven marry (eighty-six and seven-tenths, to be exact). One can form a fairly accurate judgment of the proportion of these eighty-seven who have been prepared for their adventure by considering the training of the marriageable girls he knows in various classes. Probably not over ten per cent have had systematic and well-considered education in the technique, relations and significance of the varied tasks which will be thrown upon them. It is not to the needs of the eighty-seven that modern industrial and technical education looks; it is to that of the thirteen out of one hundred who will presumably be thrown on their own resources. Parents very generally encourage this. They want their daughters prepared to take care of themselves. If anything happens, the girl encourages it; she wants to be independent. If anything happens, generally speaking, both parents and girls look to the high school, and in fewer cases the college, to do the fitting. If she has 'graduated' she can be expected to earn her living without further expense. The expectation is out of all proportion to the realization."

BUSINESS AND SCHOOLS.

"It is not the business of high schools and colleges to fit young people to earn a living," says a prominent writer. "They teach us to read that we may know what the world is thinking, feeling and doing, that we may enlarge our budget of information, correct and refine our mathematical terms in which the world measures, weighs, computes and handles all the exact sciences. It is to enable us to live with our fellows on more understanding terms that we go to school. That all of this contributes to the problem of earning our living is of course true, but that is not its object."

"In the case of a boy this is understood. We do not expect the high school to fit him for business or the college for a profession. We know that he must begin at the bottom on four, five or six dollars, and learn his business or trade. Or he must spend at least three years at his medicine or law, and then from five to ten of uncertainty and waiting, building up his position."

MOSTLY BUSINESS.

"We are a business race, we Americans," says a writer. "Nine tenths of our boys are destined for business; and the other tenth, who enter professions, need a knowledge of how business is transacted even more. Parents who cover a clean-cut, successful business career for their boy can do him a tremendous service by laying the foundations of that career while they have him still in their own hands. It was Cardinal Newman who said: 'Give me a child until he is seven years old, and I care not who has him afterward.' And psychologists are proving to us more conclusively every day the years we once considered wasted, from an educational viewpoint, are the years in which most of our habits, including business habits, have their root."

HOW TO MARKET PROFITABLY
"Going to market with your basket under your arm is old-timey," says a writer in the April Woman's Home Companion, "and I, for one, am glad a big portion of our groceries come either in packages or cans and are all guaranteed; not only that, but we have our choice of several different brands. Always order by the pound, never twenty-five cents' worth of this or fifty cents' worth of that; get as large a quantity as you think safe, weigh everything that comes by the pound, let your dealers know that you do, and you will never have a shortage of weight.
