MEXICAN HYPHENES.

Mexico can attribute the major portion of its troubles to the activities of these hyphenates within its borders. The present situation is traceable, in part at least, to their influence.

Before the people of the United States go on record as approving and confirming all the activities of the hyphenates in Mexico, it might be well to pause and consider whether we are ready to grant to so-called hyphenated Americans the same rights which we would be claiming for our own citizens who have become hyphenated Mexicans. Nobody supposes for a moment that foreign born citizens or residents of the United States would ever clean or exercise such rights; but this does not alter the fact that consistency is somewhat more of a jewel now than it ever was.
