SATURDAY NIGHT THOUGHTS.

This week has seen a small United States army on Mexican soil hunting Mexico's worst bandit, as he fell into the hills, with odds against the bandit being captured on his own territory, because of his familiarity with the country. Proceedings have been watched with intense interest. Because of the peculiar situation all manner of reports have been made of the progress of events.

A striking feature has been the persistent effort of an element in this country to make it look as if prominent members of the Carranzista government were turning against the Carranzistas in favor of Villa—full of yellow. So far Carranza has undoubtedly been loyal to our government, and his followers have done the best they could to capture the bandit; but none are so dense as those who will not see. A little thing may change the entire life of a person, making it work for good; but as a rule the successful life is built up on a determined purpose to make something definite, carried out by keeping everlastingly at it.

This is an age of exaggeration. The cartoonist almost goes to extremes in his picture arguments; but he is much like others, and that is the spirit of the age, an intense one. Cool headed people do well to weigh things and make their observations from all sides, dispassionately, not impulsively. It is a time for steady, clear-headed judgment.
