GO FOR CODLIN MOTH.

County Fruit Inspector Tells How to Treat the Enemy of Fruit Trees.

The codlin-moth must everywhere be considered one of the important factors to the fruit grower. It occurs in all sections wherever the apple is grown, and where measures are not taken for its control there is a heavy loss of the fruit. Temperature is the great factor which controls the abundance in any one year. The female moth does not lay its eggs in the spring till the temperature at night gets to or above 60 degrees, so it can readily be seen why there are more worms some years than others. If we should have a warm early spring and a hot summer we would have an extra brood of the moth.

The female moth lays about 60 eggs and the time for each generation of the moth is 5 to 7 weeks, according to the temperature. So if only a part of the eggs should mature moths to lay eggs for the second brood and having a hot summer there should have a third brood, you would have to have a lot of apples to have one for each worm. If it would be possible to get all of the first brood we would not be bothered with the second and third.

It is recommended that we in this territory apply at least three sprays during the summer for the control of the moth. First as soon as the petals fall; second, four or five weeks after the first. Third, about five weeks after the second, depending on the temperature. Use 2 lbs. of paste of one of dry Arsenate of Lead to each 50 gallons water for each application. Also for the control of the scab add 1-2 gallons of the commercial lime-sulphur to each 50 gallons to each of the above sprays. In the first spray you should endeavor to get some of the spray in the calyx of each apple bloom as the majority of the worms of the first brood, enter the apple at that point. Try and get above and spray down on the tree using considerable force as you must drive the spray into the calyx of the apple at this time. In the second and third sprays you should use a fine mist spray and cover every part of the fruit. The fruit should also be thinned so that it will not touch as that will make a fine place for the worm to enter.

Before you do any spraying there are several things you should understand. First, why you spray; second, the proper time; third, the proper mixture to use; fourth, do your work thoroughly; fifth, when done be sure to thoroughly clean the spray pump and rods.

In using the arsenate of lead you should be careful and keep it agitated as it settles very thickly.
