A copy of the contract signed by Manager James of the Majestic theatre in Portland, was exhibited in this city yesterday showing that it cost this theatre about \$3,000 for the privilege of showing Chaplin's "Carmen" for two weeks in that

city. Upon its completion in that city it will be shown in Salem for a sum considerably less, of course, and the following two days it holds forth at the Rolfe at a cost to that theatre of over \$100. From this it is seen that Charlie Chaplin easily produces the goods wherewith he makes back for the managers many times what is paid him. "The Burlesque on Carmen" is one of the two remaining Essanay pictures which that company has been holding out.

"The Ne'er Do Well" opens at the Hub today for a two days run. Those who saw Kathlyn Williams in the other Rex Beach play, "The Spoilers," will have some idea of what this feature is.
