**SATURDAY NIGHT THOUGHTS.**

This has been a nervous week in the matter of the relationship of Germany and the U. S. At the close the indications are that a break between the two countries will be prevented. At the same time negotiations are pending over a mine, and it will take little to precipitate a catastrophe. It is impossible to predict confidentially the result. There are no know-it-alls. The man back in the woods can come as near a guess as the average man under the noses of the diplomats.

The fighting around Verdun has been about as usual. A feature this week has been the appearance of three convoys of Russians to aid in the battle. Heretofore they have confined their operations to the east side. It looked at one time as if Petrograd was in danger, but that seems past. Occasionally the name British is seen in connection with the Verdun battle; but always in a minor way. One wonders what England, backed by centuries of military renown, is doing anyway.

Our border troubles have continued in the same position as a week ago, with Villa no nearer capture, so far as indications go. Every day or two something is about to happen, that's all.

Now the baseball season is rampant over the country, and the papers are full of the game, much attention being paid to the sport. It is the greatest of all games. A good player needs a good head as well as good body, and above all needs good habits. The real cause of many poor showings of teams never gets before the public. Down to a science it has gotten so it takes an expert to make a winning team.

A big need in the progress of educational development in the schools and colleges of this country is something that shall put character into the work. Students need to be given instruction in ethics and religion as much as in books, being taught that even while in college they are under the laws of their country the same as others, and that they have no special license to do things different from other people. At U. O. recently some of them dealt out libelous stuff like muckrakers. But we don't have to go out of Albany for examples of student lawlessness, with frequent cases of acts of a criminal trend.
