ROSEBURG WANTS ROAD.

Votes 7 to 1 in Favor of Ordinance Permitting Issuing of Big Bonds.

Roseburg, May 22.—By a vote of nearly seven to one, the taxpayers of Roseburg went to the polls today and authorized an amendment to the city charter making it possible for Roseburg, as a municipality, to construct and operate a standard-gauge railroad from this city to Rock Creek.

There were 651 votes cast, 557 of which were in favor of the charter amendment. Only 94 votes were mustered by the opposition.

At the time S. A. Kendall, of Pittsburg, left here, a few weeks ago, he announced that he would begin actual work on the railroad by June 15 in the event the amendment to the charter was authorized and he was awarded the contract to build the road.
