Albany people have had a case that brought the fact close to the hearts of our people, in the death by burning of a loveable girl, just starting out in life, with bright prospects along the way, surrounded by friends, full of hope, with the best ahead. Things look all right in the morning, only to be followed by gloom in the evening. A little thing changes the course of life, if it doesn't end life. One can hardly cross the street without jeopardy. Constantly must one look ahead and behind. Only eternal vigilance can keep one going.

It is pleasing to have people who come here declare that Albany looks as good as, if not the best, of any of the western Oregon cities. There is something about it that attracts attention and calls for a greater progress than it has ever attained.
