SATURDAY NIGHT THOUGHTS.

Passing the hundredth day of the battle of Verdun this week the world has seen another record made. Some records are sought with enthusiasm; but this kind of a record is creditable to no one or nation. One hundred days, without even stopping on Sundays to go to church, of the bloodiest fighting in the history of the world, is something to make one see a red moon. During this long period some progress has been made by the aggressors, the Germans, who have gradually gotten nearer their goal, almost like a snail creeping along. One wonders what the Russians are doing on the other side with their enormous army, so little that the Germans are able to withdraw an army without weakening their eastern line. One wonders what the British are doing, loud when parliament meets; but little noticed in battle, as seen from across the ocean. The mastery generalship of the Germans is attracting wide attention.

We continue to have our troubles with Mexico. This week has seen made public a note from Carranza, in which he very emphatically requests the U. S. to withdraw its troops from Mexico. Under the circumstances, of course, our government will do nothing of the kind. Mexicans invaded this country, just bandits, but about as much a part of the country as anyone, and it was the business of the U. S. to follow them and punish them, as the alleged Mexican government was doing nothing to take care of the Villistas. Carranza will put his head in a noose if he continues his present policy.

The approach of two national conventions is causing great interest in the country, and with reason. One is already settled, leaving only the formality for the convention, with the adoption of a platform. The other promises to be a dog and cat affair. Elements are at work which cannot mix any more than oil and water, and this means friction. Throwing Roosevelt into the ring means a fight, for it suggests things an element in the party will not endorse.

Something that does not set well here is the movement made to gobble up Albany College by Pacific University. In the first place it is a matter that should not have been made public at the present time. In the second place it is a very unfortunate affair that will do the cause of education no good.

Albany College has done a splendid work, making a fine reputation as an educational institution, and just now, after a colossal effort to secure an endowment is entitled to all the fruits of it, and any effort to cause trouble is certainly ill-advised.
