**A GREAT INDUSTRY.**

Probably the most stable industry in Oregon today is stock raising. Wherever there is plenty of stock there is prosperity. In sections almost exclusively devoted to stock raising there is no complaint of hard times and cannot be. In this valley, without so much, wherever stock raising and dairying prevails most extensively there is the best times. Perhaps Albany's biggest asset is the business of the Albany creameries and cheese maker, between \$200,000 and \$300,000 a year.

One thing that has done much to advance the stock interests of the state is the big annual stock show at Portland. A recent editorial in the Telegram is particularly timely, and the Democrat is glad to repeat it:

The bankers of the state have set the seal of their approval upon the live stock show which is now annually held in North Portland and translated their confidence into terms of dollars—\$10,000 to be specific. This means that the show will be financed as never before, therefore that things can be done which never could have been done before.

The Portland show is different from any other show in the country. It now ranks next to the great International Live Stock show at Chicago which means that it is the second show in consequence held in the United States. But it is not run as a moneymaking affair. There are no charges for admission; everybody is welcome. Everybody is received with open arms and made to feel that his presence is appreciated. Until the live-stock show began here it was not generally recognized that the Willamette valley was the ideal spot in the United States for the raising of high grade stock. Stockmen from over the country have been more surprised over this outlook than any other. They have been surprised at the quality of the stock, beef and dairy, but they have been still more surprised to find here the natural conditions to so happily blend to produce them.

A few years ago people would have been satisfied to have had Portland recognized as the pure bred stock center of the Pacific coast. But now nothing short of actual rivalry with the International at Chicago will satisfy those in charge of it. In following this line they are simply following the line of least resistance. All that is needed is a little careful direction and the growth will follow as a matter of course. The Pacific Northwest is growing proud of the annual stock show. It will grow prouder as time goes on for it is already one of the two great events in the pure bred stock business of the country.
