ALBANY MAN TELLS ABOUT LOS ANGELES ENCAMPMENT

The City Is a Great Place For
Good Treatment and Un-
surpassed Trips.

Los Angeles, Cal., June 24, 1916.
To the Democrat:
The thirty-third triennial encampment, Knights Templar, just closing, was full of enjoyment to those in attendance.

The local members of the order, municipality, and citizens generally spared no expense or efforts to give the visiting Templars and those accompanying them on this pilgrimage every opportunity for a good time.

On Monday the entire membership of the grand encampment with their ladies, about 450 people, were given a day's trip to Avalon, Catalina Islands, with dinner at the Avalon Hotel. This is 17 miles by electric car to San Pedro and 28 miles by steamer to Catalina. This is a beautiful island and through the glass bottom boats the wonderful submarine gardens may be seen.

Each Templar visitor and his ladies were furnished a coupon book of tickets, calling for auto rides about Los Angeles and vicinity, electric car rides 20 miles away to Long Beach, Venice, Santa Monica and other nearby cities as well as a trip to Universal City, where so many photo plays are staged.

The stars of filmdom are very common about the City of the Angels, the admirers of Charlie Chaplin may see their hero, accompanied by his wife, going daily for luncheon to the "Pig'n Whistle" restaurant.

The parade on Tuesday was an impressive sight, made up as it was of ten divisions of Knights Templar from the United States and dependencies with representatives from England, Ireland, Wales, Scotland and Canada.

The Oregon delegation, headed by R. E. Sir Louis G. Clarke, grand commander, made quite a hit. The Oregon grand commandery band and drill corps and knights, about 150 Oregon men in line, each being decorated with an Oregon rosette which called forth favorable comment from the spectators.

Wednesday evening the grand commandery of Oregon received at the Hotel Lankershim Grand Commander Clarke and Mrs. R. D. Robinson, heading the receiving line. The Hawaiian orchestra furnished music and many gallons of loganberry juice was dispensed to the thirsty callers.

Each evening a score or more of receptions are available for those who desire to attend them.
