Cattle.—There was the smallest run of cattle today for several weeks, consisting chiefly of "trashy steers." Cows and heifers sold on a steady basis with last week, but steers showed some weakness. Calves steady.

Hog.—On a very small run of less than 2300 head, the market made a gain of 10 cents, tops selling at \$8.30. Demand is good and market closed on a strong basis.

Sheep.—Sheep market did not show any revival of strength. Lambs unless prime are not bringing a very strong price. Ordinary sheep are showing the most weakness. Market closed at steady to weak.

SOUTHERN PACIFIC TO LOOK AFTER ITS EMPLOYEES

Those Going to War Will Receive Pay, and Jobs Will Be Held.

The Southern Pacific company announces that those of its employees who were members on June 17, 1916, of the National Guard of any state its lines traverse, and who are called out for army service are granted leave of absence with the understanding that they will retain their promotion rights and they can resume their positions with the company when the govern-

ment relieves them from service.

While such employees are serving in the army in response to the call of the government, the company will also allow, until September 30 of this year, to enlisted men, whether non-commissioned officers or privates:

1. To those married, full pay.
2. To those unmarried, with families dependent upon them for support, three-quarters to full pay, according to controlling circumstances.
3. To those unmarried, without dependent families, half pay.

The company will allow to commissioned officers above and including the grade of second lieutenant:

1. To those married, the difference between company and government pay, when government pay is less.
2. To those unmarried with de-

Act of Congress Calls for Boys Under 18 With Parents' Consent.

The government has issued the following:

War Department, the Adjutant-General's Office, Washington, D. C., June 23.—To All Officers of the General Recruiting Service:

The act of Congress approved June 3, 1916, "The National Defense Act," as construed by this department, re-
