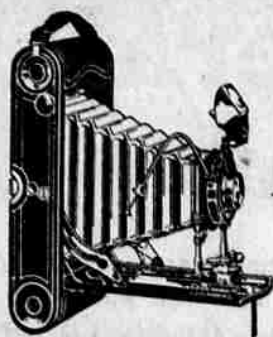
More Dodges—
