### FLAGS FURNISHED FOR CHAUTAUQUA BY CONSULS

Of the banners which will be seen at the Chautauqua tonight, the large white flag with the German eagle in the center belong to the German Red Cross Society, of Portland, and at the close of the present European war will become the property of the Portland Turn Verein society. The German national flag is the one in use at the German Haus, the headquarters of the Portland Turn Verein society. These two flags were secured for use at the Chautauqua through the personal solicitation of Mr. Fritz Kirchhoff, the German consul.

The National Standard and the Union Jack of Great Britain are the property of the Clan Macleay, a Scottish society of Portland.

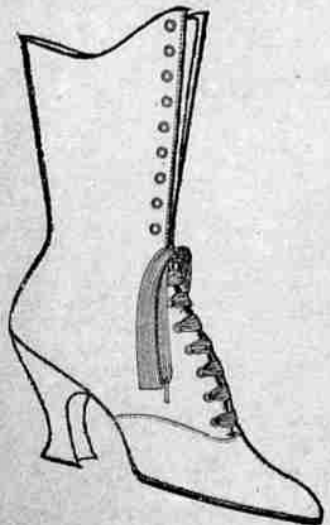
