**MARSHFIELD TO HAVE A BIG CELEBRATION AUG. 24-26**  
The Completion of Willamette-Pacific Is to Be Made An Event.  
E. J. Arnold, the veteran live-wire showman of the Willamette valley, was in the city yesterday spreading

his optimism around on the subject of the Coos Bay Railroad jubilee, which will be held at Marshfield and Coos Bay points August 24, 25, and 26. The bay towns are preparing to give the world a big treat on these days and are going to unlimited expense in providing entertainment to the vast throngs that will crowd into the port on these days. Marshfield will spend over \$10,000 alone in providing entertainment.  
The plan to be enforced will be to give the visitors as much for nothing as possible. All visitors will be met and provided with a badge. No money will be taken for auto rides, or any other similar form of amusement. The idea is to advertise Coos Bay and show the world what has been bottled up in the southwestern part of the state all these years.  
The entertainment features will include a huge free clam bake, street dances, private dances, ball games, aquatic sports, motor boat races and a big free excursion in trains and automobiles from Marshfield to North Bend, Conville, Myrtle Point, and other Coos Bay towns.  
The excursions run to Marshfield on these days will perhaps be the biggest ever run to a similar event. Owing to the rivalry between Oregon and California for Coos Bay trade, a big excursion consisting of both a trainload and a boatload of people from the San Francisco chamber of commerce will be run. The Portland chamber of commerce will send a big delegation on the Portland Journal special.

The Eugene Radiators will send one full train and possibly two, while the Salem Cherrians are getting up a crowd that will include between 50 and 100 people. Is Albany going to be represented in this great trade event, her citizens rubbing shoulders with the merchants of the other towns and cities of the coast? Roseburg will also send a big delegation.
