foot in Two Years.Chicago, July 25.—Special.—"This
country is in the throes of a leather
famine. Unless the world develops a
substitute for leather within two
years America will be the next wood-
en shoe nation. Shoes will cost \$10 a
pair, high legged boots will be a lux-
ury beyond the reach of all save mil-
lionaires and the people will wear
wooden shoes, snadals, or go bare-
footed."These were declarations made by
delegates to the Shoe Retailers' As-
sociation at Hotel LaSalle today. It
was the first annual session and grew
out of the necessity of organizing
shoe dealers to meet unprecedented
conditions of famine and arrested
supply both now and in the future.R. W. Ranney, president of the as-
sociation, said:
"Few Americans are aware of the
extent of the embargo placed against
shipment out of subject countries by
the allies. Our supply of cattle has
been reduced almost to the vanishing

**BROWN DOWN ON THE
BORDER WRITES HOME**Corvallis Editor Gets on the
Inside of the Situation and
Tells It.M. J. Brown, of the Corvallis Cour-
ier, is down on the border, writing
red hot facts to his paper. He says
that the border towns down there all
want war, simply because it will make
business for them, boom every state
along the border. Sandiego has lost
ten thousand population and it wants
to get it back."The exploiters have grabbed some
of the richest of Mexico," said an at-
torney of me. "They have the oil,
mines, railroads, and grazing lands,
and now, they want this country to
go down and make their gamblers'
chances good. Let them protect them-
selves."But this expression I found more
general than any other: That the bor-
der troubles would continue, no mat-
ter what kind of an adjustment might
be made; that sooner or later this
country would be forced to intervene;
that no Mexican government could
protect the border from these raids
because it would require a greater ar-
my than Carranza or any other defac-
to ruler could spare; that the raids
would be planned and paid for by
American money to force interven-
tion; that we could not keep a big
army policing the border indefinitely,
therefore the sooner we went in and
got the job over the better.In other words the U. S. forced to
intervene in Mexico to protect itself
from the plots and program of its
own people.A soldier said:
"Why should I have to go into
Mexico to protect the Walter-Pierce
Oil Co.? It is none of my business
that they have big interests down
there. I am a plumber, I have a wife
and five children. I can and will pro-
tect my own family if they will let
me alone. Let the American finan-
ciers protect themselves. They won't
look after my family, neither will
they go into Mexico and fight for
their own interests—not a one of
them will be there. And why should
