Scaled bids will be received by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon until 7:30 o'clock p. m., August 9th, 1916, for the construction of an eight-inch lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in the Oak St. trunk sewer between 1st and 2nd streets and running thence eastward through Block 16 in Hackleman's Third Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon, a distance of 282 feet.

Said sewer construction to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer on file in the office of the recorder of the said city, where the plans may be seen and specifications and estimates obtained. Bids will be opened at 7:30 o'clock p. m., August 9th, 1916.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Albany in an amount equal to five percent, of the aggregate bid to be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder neglects or refuses to enter into a contract and provide an approved bond in the sum of \$150 for the faithful performance of said contract; said work to be begun within ten days after notification of awarding of contract to such bidder.

All bids must be made with a view of completing the construction of said sewer prior to the 1st day of September 1916, under a liquidated penalty of \$250 per day for each day of delay beyond that time.

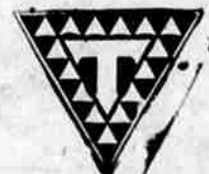
