SATURDAY NIGHT THOUGHTS.

The principal thing about the European war is the fact that the second anniversary of it is just here this Saturday night. Looking back at the awful murderfest one is almost paralyzed at the totals presented. The cost in money: \$49,350,000,000. Great Britain, though making a very poor showing, is credited with the most, \$13,000,000,000, with Germany next, \$12,500,000,000. Russia's figures are 8 billions, France over 7 billions, Austria 6 billions, etc. The average daily cost has been \$67,510,295. At the present time it is \$100,000,000 a day.

In killing Russia leads with 1,200,000, 2,500,000 wounded, 2,000,000 missing. Germany is next with 900,000 killed, 1,900,000 wounded and 150,000 missing. France's total is about the same; Austria's nearly as many. Great Britain leading in expense, is credited with only 160,000 killed, 450,000 wounded and 70,000 missing. A total given for all the countries is, 3,805,000 killed; 7,870,000 wounded; 3,680,000 missing, making a total of 15,355,000. Aren't those figures enough to make one dizzy?

The dark ages could not offer a greater example of brutality.

The Mexican border is quiet enough for the jingoists to become nervous, and we may look for some disturbance almost any day. Billy Hearst is becoming very impatient, according to a San Francisco paper.

In congress this week about seven hundred million dollars has been appropriated for national defense, at least so far as the senate is concerned. This is a good deal, but it is small compared with what we would be expending if we had been thrust into the maelstrom of war itself. In Europe that much is being spent every seven days.

The entire world is watching things at Baltimore anxious to see what the Deutschland does. Almost universally the sentiment is in favor of the success of the expedition home, simply because the world loves bravery, and such daring excites admiration.
