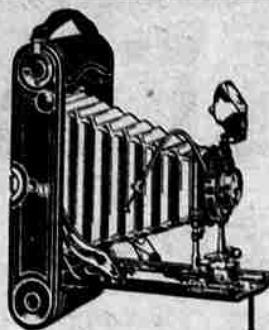
the color scheme by being dressed in pink and white.

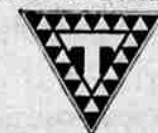
