**M. V. WEATHERFORD.**

(From the Pacific Patriot)  
The congressional situation in Oregon this year is unprecedented from the standpoint of the possibilities which it holds for the Prohibition party. In the First District the candidate for the Prohibition party is also the Democratic nominee, Mark V. Weatherford, an attorney, of Albany. He is a straight-forward, clean-cut young man, very strong in his own community. He is a graduate of the Oregon Agricultural College of the class of 1907; also, a graduate of the law department of the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, in 1910. His law practice has taken him over a large part of the First District. He is thoroughly familiar with the harbor and shipping conditions of the Northwest and earnestly advocates increased and improved shipping facilities in order that the wealth of the timbered and coast counties may be unlocked. He is a man of peace. He does not believe in more than a reasonable preparedness, but rather that "our citizenship should develop our commercial and industrial enterprises and improve our moral and social standing at home than to seek our nation's doubtful fame in a war of our own choosing."

Mr. Weatherford has always been a temperance man. His position upon the liquor question is publicly and concisely stated in the following language:

"In response to your inquiry as to my position upon the question of prohibition permit me to say that I am heartily in sympathy with the Prohibition party to rid the country of the liquor evil; and I will, if elected to congress from the First Oregon, work for any and all measures which tend to accomplish this most desired end. "I will accept the principles of the Prohibition party upon the liquor question, consider myself the champion of its cause and the representative of its membership. I further assure you that if elected to congress I will not be bound by any caucus which attempts in any way to delay or prevent prohibition legislation in the congress of the United States."

Mr. Weatherford is not a self-starter in politics. His nomination to congress was tendered him by the Democratic party writing his name in upon the ballot and by the Prohibition party nominating him at the congressional convention. He has accepted each of these nominations and is making an active and aggressive campaign. He is a live, energetic, wide awake young man whose character and standing is above reproach and deserves the enthusiastic support of all Prohibition workers which he is so generously receiving.
