PEOPLE WANT WILSON.

The mailbag of the president of the United States contains at all times documents of rare human interest. Since President Wilson's renomination the volume of his mail has increased tremendously. From all parts of the country men and women write to him telling him that he is right and assuring him that the thinking people are with him.

At the request of Robert W. Woolley, director of the publicity of the Democratic National Committee, the president's secretary, Mr. Tummely, collected a folio of such correspondence, typical of the expressions that are coming daily in the president's mail bag. With the express permission of the writers, some of these letters have been given out at Democrat's national headquarters in New York for publication.

John L. Sullivan, editor and manager of the Evening Leader, and the St. Mary's Argus, of St. Mary's, O., wrote to the president on July 16 as follows: "Sir:—It may be of some interest to you to know that all of the so-called 'Prodigal Sons' who left their father's house—the Republican party—in 1912 and identified themselves with the Progressive party, have not returned to receive the parental blessing."

"In that memorable year I was nominated by acclamation as the Republican candidate for secretary of state. A few weeks later I was nominated for the same position by the State Progressive convention. I withdrew from the Republican ticket and chose what I believed to be the better part. To my mind the Republican party had reached a point where it represented the very antithesis of progressive principles, and, after the lapse of four years I fail to see anything in the leadership or platform of the party indicating a return to its earlier traditions. I am, therefore, going to do something this year that I have never done before since I reached my maturity—cast my vote for the Democratic candidate for president of the United States."

"It is incomprehensible to me how a real Progressive can do otherwise than vote for your reelection. You have done more to restore and apply the principle of popular rule than any president since days of Thomas Jefferson. That influence has done more than all things else towards doing away with the necessity of a third party in this country, and it is the secret of why the Progressive party has lost its vitality."

"I for one am not deceived by the hypocritical pretensions of the Republican party that it has been regenerated. It is the same old party of special privilege and it can no more conceal its identity than the Ethiopian can change his color or the leopard its spots. Therefore, the real Progressive whose vision, whose ideals, comprehend something better and higher and nobler than mere partisan reward and political provender, will seek shelter with the party that represents the better standards of government—the Democratic party."

"I am for you without mental reservation or apology, and I have much confidence in the good sense and discriminating judgment of the American people to predict your triumphant reelection."

D., a Lutheran pastor, brought his evening audience of seventy up to 500 in a few weeks, and at Easter received sixty new members. Binghamton merchants offered the church all their regular space for one Saturday; church advertisements filled the paper, and Sunday the increase was 30 per cent. A group of Seattle men promised to do the publicity work for two weeks of special meetings to be conducted by three downtown pastors. They hired a brass band, paraded, burned red fire on street corners, bought space in daily papers and filled the church. Three thousand persons signed cards and 500 became members. B. M. Brown, a lay preacher, bought \$100 worth of space in a Chicago paper and printed therein the Bible verse found in 1 Thessalonians 4:13 to chapter 5:7. The next day two business

men met him to announce that as a result they would be avowed Christians.
