BIG ONE ON HUGHES.

Albert de Roode, for six years as-sistant secretary of Civil Service Reform association and now its counsel. shows from the records that Mr. Hughes as governor of New York ordered 218 civil service exemptions in less than four years, as against 182 exemptions in Odell's four years and sixty-two in Higgins' two years In addition, under the Hughes ad ministration there were 345 "special exemptions" with \$1,076,249.88 compensation, where appointments were made to competitive positions, created under Gov. Hughes, served as dispensers of over \$1,000,000 in spoils. During the first year of the opera tion of the law sixty-seven positions were exempted by Mr. Hughes.

"As a matter of fact," says Mr. de Roode, "those interested in civil service reform made repeated efforts during the Hughes administration to have him appoint a vigorous com-mission in full sympathy with the merit system, but without success."
