Weather Report—

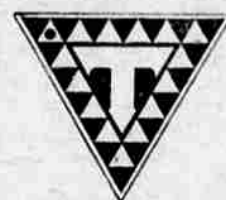
Yesterday's temperature ranged between 33 and 71 degrees. The river stands at 1.1 feet.

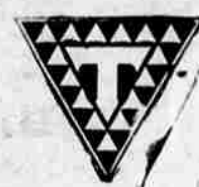
