### FERN HOBBS WORKING ON O. & C. LAND TAX

Former Secretary to Governor West Visits Courthouse Unknown to Officials.

Miss Fern Hobbs, private secretary to Oswald West during the time he was governor of Oregon, was in the city today looking up information regarding the taxes on the Oregon and California grant lands. She is from the office of Louis L. Sharp, chief of the field division of the department of the interior, of Portland. Statements have already been sent for the taxes due Linn county for the years 1913, 1914 and 1915, which amount to \$42,370. With accrued interest these will total about \$43,000 due the county.

However, more information was wanted by the land office and additional statements were sent out. Miss Hobbs is making visits to the various county seats in an effort to hurry up these statements and see that everything is understood.
