INCOME OF LANE FARMS GREATLY INCREASED

The value of county agents in the development of farming interests is shown in a striking manner by the following from the Eugene Guard:

The average income of the Lane county farmer was \$222 more in 1915 than in 1914, according to the report of H. F. Keyes, farm management demonstrator for the Oregon Agricultural College in cooperation with the United States department of agriculture. The report is the result of an investigation of farming conditions in Lane county that has been conducted by Mr. Keyes during the last two years.

Mr. Keyes finds that there has been practically no increase in the capital invested by the farmers, nor has there been a noticeable increase in the total amount of acreage of 11 per cent in the amount of stock raised; the average farm had 127 acres of corn and 115 acres of clover, in 1914; in 1915 the average farm included 195 acres of corn and 288 acres of clover. Thus, the farmers grew one and one-half as much corn last year as during the year before, and produced two and one-half times as much clover.

"The raising of more corn, clover and livestock and less grain is going to mean more prosperity in Lane county," said Mr. Keyes.

The work being done by Mr. Keyes is designed to help the farmers to run their farms upon a business basis, whereby they can tell definitely just what their farms are producing and better discover how they may be made to produce more.

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HARVARD TO WAKE UP.

Football Team to Change Old Tactics to New and More Open Field Playing.

New York, Oct. 19.—When Harvard and Yale clash Nov. 25 in their annual big football game, the Harvard coaches may surprise followers of the game by the method of playing they adopt for the encounter.

After years of adherence to trick formations and smashing attack, and concentration upon kickers the Harvard team has been trying out the open game this year. The coaches have been laying more and more stress upon hidden ball and forward pass plays, which, in the last few

years, have been rather side-tracked in favor of straight football.

The conservative style of football, which has been Harvard's since Percy Haughton took charge of the team, is not favored so greatly by assistant coaches who have had much to do with building the team this year and the open formations probably will get their share of attention in the big game. They probably have not been given the full sanction of the famous coach but he doubtless will give a large bit of attention to the open style.
