**A WOMAN'S FRIEND.**

That Thomas Alva Edison deserves more than any other man the title of friend of womankind is the firm conviction of Mrs. Winston Churchill, who is one of the women in charge of a suffrage booth at the Electrical exposition being held in New York. These women are demonstrating the uses of electrical apparatus in the home.

"Women all over the world acknowledge their debt to the liberator, Edison," Mrs. Churchill is quoted as saying. "A hundred years ago few indeed would have been the women who could have or would have wished to discuss with Benjamin Franklin the nature and attributes of that mysterious fluid which he sought to trap with kite and key. Today 'what every woman knows' includes electricity in its application to labor-saving devices of all kinds. They can calculate its cost to a kilowatt, just as they know the nourishing values of the food they prepare. They have learned that efficiency in the home is as important as in any field of life and labor, and contributes to the power and contentment of those for whom the home is made.

"Nature may abhor a vacuum, but not so the woman who lightens her labors with one that cleans for her, nor does she abhor the useful vacuum that holds heat and cold at an even temperature for hours at a time.

"In heating, lighting, cooking and cleaning the wizard Edison has made an Aladdin's palace of the smallest home."

This is indeed, a notable tribute. People are often inclined to think of the great inventor in terms of his more spectacular productions, as they alone made his fame. Not so. If Edison has given us the movies, he has also, by electric home machinery, given the woman leisure to attend the movies. She does not listen evening after evening to good music played from records in the parlor without having been set from lamp cleaning and broom-wielding, so that she may listen without having previously accumulated a fatigue so painful that she is incapable of attention and enjoyment.

The presentation to the world, of the splendid mental, spiritual and artistic powers of woman by the simple process of loosing her from the unnecessary drudgery which previously imprisoned her will be the great achievement of the twentieth century. In doing a large share of this liberating, Edison is not only the woman's friend. He is the friend of all society.

**TAKE CARE OF TEETH.**

The United States public health service gives some strong tooth advice:

A recent investigation made by the U. S. Public Health service in connection with studies of rural school children showed that 49.3 per cent had defective teeth, 21.1 per cent had two or more missing teeth, and only 16.9 per cent had had dental attention. Over 14 per cent never used a tooth brush, 58.2 per cent used one occasionally and only 27.4 per cent used one daily. Defective teeth reduce physical efficiency. Dirty, suppurating, toothed mouths are responsible for many cases of heart disease, rheumatism, and other chronic affections. The children are not responsible for the neglected state of their teeth. The ignorant and careless parent is to blame for this condition—a condition which hampers mental and physical growth and puts a permanent handicap on our future citizens. School teachers can and are doing much in inculcating habits of personal cleanliness on the rural school child but this will fail of the highest accomplishment unless parents cooperate heartily and continuously. This is a duty which we owe our children.
