POULTRY SHOW NEXT MONTH WILL BE GOOD

World Wide Competition Invited and Large Number of Entries Will Be Shown.

Preparations are going ahead for the Annual Poultry Show which will be held in this city Thursday to Saturday, Dec. 13 to 16. The place of meeting has not been chosen yet, but it is hoped that the armory may be secured.

The officers of the Central Willamette Poultry Show are Ed. Schoel, president; W. E. Baker, vice-president; Mrs. C. W. Vunk, secretary; R. L. Torbet, treasurer; A. J. Steel, superintendent. The show will be judged by Harry H. Collier, of Seattle, an eminent authority on chickens.

Plans to make this the biggest and best poultry show ever held in the valley are under way. Entries are already being received and there is no doubt but that the list will be larger than at any previous show in this city. There will be 17 cups offered for prizes, besides the cash prizes. Entries are open to everybody, no section barred. And there will be no admission charged to the public.

This will be a score card show. Amateur chicken breeders who have never had their stock registered or scored before will find this of distinct advantage to them. Score cards will

be kept for every entry, on which will be shown all the defects and good points of the fowls. This will be a help in future breeding, and will give the owners a chance to know just what they have.

Any of the officers of the association will be pleased to answer questions regarding the show, and correspondence is invited by the management.

TRAIL MARKERS WILL HEAR REPORT FRIDAY

Judge Stewart Will Read Carefully Prepared Paper at Library.

At a meeting of the Linn County Historical Association, called by President C. H. Stewart for Friday evening, Judge Stewart's report on the marking of the old pioneer immigrant train through the county will be read. Also the report of Judge Wilson, of Corvallis, who has been going over the route in Benton county, will be given.

Judge Stewart has been working several months on his paper and now believes it to be in very good shape, indicating accurately the course taken by the earlier pioneers in traveling through the valley south.

The trail marking is being done under the auspices of the Daughters of the Revolution, who are placing monuments along the way to mark the routes traveled by the settlers of the west.

The meeting will be held in the library building Friday evening.
