THE TOURIST

The next legislature will be asked to appropriate \$25,000 for two years for the support of The Pacific Northwest Tourist association of Oregon, Washington and British Columbia, says an Oregon Ex. Washington is to appropriate a like amount, and British Columbia half that amount. The money would be expended in advertising The Pacific Northwest Scenic Tours, including all the natural attractions of Oregon, Washington and British Columbia and in paying the salaries of Eastern agents whose duty it would be to interest easterners in the scenic attractions of the Pacific northwest—in other words to sell our scenery and climate. While many might finally locate on the coast as a result of this campaign, the object would merely be to attract tourist traffic—the kind that comes, sees, spends its money and goes back home.

The tourist crop is a never-failing one. No unforeseen circumstances affect it. It always brings a big price. The money is scattered into every community. Americans spend annually some 700 millions in travel and sight-seeing. California has been getting 200 millions of that amount each year, and has no more to offer than has Oregon.

California has developed its tourist crop through advertising in the east. That is the way Oregon can develop a similar crop.

With the differential in passenger rates removed, there is no reason why Oregon cannot get as much out of the tourist crop as does her southern sister, which has no Crater Lake, no Columbia river highway and has not nearly as much of the rugged natural beauty as has Oregon.

The sum asked with which to start development work is small. The amount might well be saved where it is now wasted, and devoted to this purpose, where there will be a large return on the investment.

HONEST PEOPLE

The following test as to honesty on the part of the average person was tried recently, says an exchange.

One dollar was mailed to each of 100 New Yorkers, with an accompanying letter stating that this money was due from an imaginary company. Anybody receiving the dollar would see at once that it had been sent him (or her) by mistake, and if honest—would hasten to return it to the sender. Fifty men and 50 women, of various professions, were chosen as the victims or material for this laboratory experiment. Thirty-three women and 31 men returned the dollar. Sixty-four New Yorkers out of a hundred are apparently proved honest.

As a matter of fact the score should be still higher. It is logical to excuse some of the 100 on the grounds they may have accepted as true the statement that they had the money due them from some company. Others may have failed to return the money because of neglect or indifference, rather than because of dishonesty.

There are lots of honest people in the world despite the cynics. Furthermore the number is increasing and will continue to increase. Improved commercial standards require it.
