STATE Y.M.C.A.'S PROGRAM FOR THE COMING YEAR

The state Y. M. C. A. sends out the following outline of plans for the year 1917, speaking for the high purposes of the association:

1. Continuation and enlargement of work with boys, including additional conferences, enlargement of summer camps, and more high school groups.
2. State Convention at Albany March 2-4, with the following probable speakers: A. E. Roberts, County Work Secretary Int. Comm.; C. C. Robinson, Secretary for Employed Boys, Int. Comm.; Raymond Robbins, Evangelist and Social Service leader; A. A. Hyde, Manufacturer and Philanthropist, Wichita, Kansas.
3. Survey of field with view to organization of county associations in the future.
4. Close attention to local organizations, with visits under the direction of the committee, by specialists from other associations to stimulate the different departments of work.
5. The promotion of thrift among various groups of men and boys.
6. Preparation for raising the debts which are burdening many local associations.
7. Organization of two new city associations, one of which may be community or non-equipment type.
8. Establishment of work in one or more industrial centers.

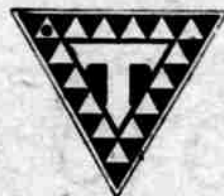
