EQUADOR'S 8 HOUR LAW

Whatever the supreme court may decide about the Adamson law, there is one American country that has a real, "water-tight" eight-hour law.

No, it isn't Canada, or Mexico, or the Argentine republic.

It is Ecuador, that tiny triangular country, squeezed in between Peru and Columbia, that looks as if it were sliding off the steep sides of the Andes straight into the Pacific.

Ecuador is the only nation in the world with an eight-hour law that includes every employe in the country, pays time and a quarter for better for overtime, and has no loopholes for any favored industries.

The whole meat of law, which has just been put into effect is in three short, simple articles:

1. Every laborer, working man, clerk in store, office or industrial establishment, and in general, every employe of any kind, shall not be forced to work more than eight hours daily, six days a week, and is exempt from work on Sundays and legal holidays.

2. No employe can evade the accomplishment of this decree by and stipulation with the employe or laborer.

3. If the laborer, workman, clerk, etc., be requested to work longer than eight hours, he shall be paid 25 per cent overtime for extra work done during the day, 50 per cent overtime from 6 in the evening to midnight, and 100 per cent after that hour.
