PREPARING FOR SIEGE

School To Teach Billy Sunday Campaigners How To Work In New York.

New York, Jan. 23.—(By United Press)—The second weekly session of the 827 citizen students who are studying to be personal workers for Billy Sunday at the big tabernacle

during his campaign here beginning April 1, will be held here tonight. The corps is composed of 6 members each from the 200 churches in New York. They are studying books and charted maps of the human soul, showing the best point of attack and the form it should take for any given situation they may encounter in helping Sunday win via the sawdust trail.

On State Examining Board—

Dr. W. P. White has just been appointed on the state examining board by State Sup. of Public Instruction J. A. Churchill. Dr. White's duties will be to examine papers written by Bible class students in the high schools. Bible study is now an elective course in most high schools of the state. Dr. White has received the first papers, a huge pile from Eastern Oregon, and will devote half an hour a week at his task for the next four months.

FIRST TAXES FOR 1916 ARE PAID TODAY

The first tax receipt to be issued on the 1916 rolls went to W. S. Johnson, of this city, who paid \$43.70 on 135 acres of land located near Knox Butte. Mr. Johnson paid all of his taxes and was issued receipt No. 1. The tax statements have not been sent out yet by Sheriff Bodine, for his office force is still busy writing up the listings. They will be sent out in a short time, however. But any one who cares to call and pay up can do so. The first half of the 1916 taxes are due before April 5th, after which date, if they are not paid, that portion will draw interest at the rate of one per cent a month until Oct 5th, when the entire amount becomes delinquent and draws interest at the rate of one per cent a month. If they are not paid on Nov 5th following, a penalty of five per cent is added besides the interest.

BILL FOR PROHIBITION OF FALSE ADVERTISING

By Senator Orton:

A Bill for an act prohibiting untrue, deceptive and misleading assertions, representation or statements of fact in advertisements within the State of Oregon and providing a penalty for the violation thereof, and to repeal Section 2230 of Lord's Oregon Laws and all Acts and parts of Acts in conflict herewith.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Oregon: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association, with intent to sell or dispose of merchandise, securities, service or anything offered by such person, firm, corporation or association, directly or indirectly, to the public for sale or distribution, or with intent to increase the consumption thereof, or to induce the public in any manner to enter into any obligation relating thereto, or to acquire title thereto, or an interest therein, to make publish, disseminate, circulate, or place before the public, or cause, directly or indirectly, to be made, published, disseminated, circulated, or placed before the public within the State of Oregon, in a newspaper or other publication, or in the form of a book, notice, handbill, sign, poster, bill, circular, pamphlet, tag, label, or letter, or in any other way or manner whatsoever, an advertisement of any sort regarding merchandise, securities, service, or anything offered to the public, which advertisement contains any assertion, representation or statement of fact which is untrue, deceptive or misleading.

Sec. 2. Any person, firm, corporation or association violating any of the provisions hereof shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding thirty (30) days.

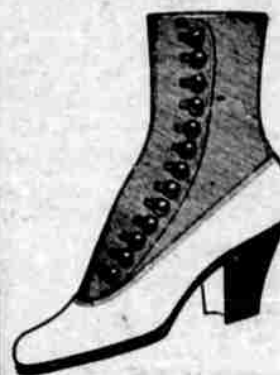

PROPOSED NEW OR. ROAD

by the county.

The County Court shall designate, with the approval of the State Highway Commission, the roads that shall be known as County Roads and those that shall be known as District Roads—the County Roads being those that lead to the market centers throughout the County, and the District Roads being the intervening roads. In case the County Court refuses to make such classification of the Roads, the State Highway Commission is empowered to make such selection for the counties.

The Road Districts shall remain intact as they now are, and on the second Saturday of November, 1917, and annually thereafter, the legal voters of each district (except Road Districts composed of incorporated cities or towns) shall meet and elect three road District Trustees from among the residents of the District, who shall serve without pay, and who shall employ a competent man to maintain the roads in their District. All construction and improvement of roads is to be under the charge and direction of the county engineer or road master, but the maintenance is in charge of the District Trustees, but

under the supervision of the county road master. At the annual meeting the legal voters of each district shall also decide on the district tax levy for road construction and maintenance, said levy not to exceed ten mills; and shall also decide what portion is to be expended for maintenance (which is not to exceed four mills), and what portion is to be expended for road construction.

The District Trustees shall have the right at any time to call on the County Engineer or Road Master to furnish service or special engineering service in connection with the maintenance of the District Roads. The County Trustees shall also have power to require bonds from those who are engaged in the maintenance of the roads in the district.

All road construction or bridge work projects that cost \$500.00 or more shall be done by contract, and the contract shall be awarded to the lowest bidder. Projects costing less than that amount may be handled directly by the county engineer, under the supervision of the County Court.

The bill provides that a half a mill shall be raised annually for the improvement of State Highways, and not to exceed ten mills, by each county for the construction and maintenance of the County and District Roads. It further provides for the licensing of all motor vehicles, and it is estimated that the returns from these licenses and a half mill state tax will provide at least a million dollars annually to be used on the State Highways.
