COLLEGE SNOBBERY

An admirable revolt against college snobbery has started in Princeton. A group of sophomores, including a son of Grover Cleveland and other students of unquestioned standing, have announced that they will not join any of the exclusive clubs for which Princeton is noted.

Princeton's so-called "dining clubs" correspond to the fraternities of most other colleges. Nearly all American colleges have such a system of clubs, which, no matter what names they may bear, are actually exclusive social organizations.

College life as a whole suffers. All students tend to attach undue importance to social distinction. Democracy is lost sight of, in the very institutions which ought to be bulwarks of democracy.

Clubs and democracy are not incompatible, provided there are clubs for everybody. The Princeton move, which has the support of President Hibben, is a step in the right direction.
