GOVERNMENT WATCHING FOR DISLOYALTY AMONG PEOPLE

Following is the letter which U. S. District Attorney Reames has sent out to all the state district attorneys: "I respectfully request that you at once get in touch with the sheriff's office in your county and also with the several police departments of the larger cities in your county and ascertain as far as possible the names and addresses of all persons concerning whom there is any danger that they may commit an overt act against the authority of the United States on account of the present foreign situation. This office is anticipating little difficulty in Oregon and believes that the great majority of the people of either German or Austrian birth or parentage, whether citizens or not, would be loyal to the United States. However, as a purely precautionary matter I would appreciate it if you would advise me promptly of the situation in your county, furnishing me with any information in regard to either threats against the United States or the possibility of danger to any of the property or rights of the United States growing out of the foreign situation."
