ARMED NEUTRALITY

In his inaugural address yesterday, President Wilson said:

"We have been obliged to arm ourselves to make good our claim to a certain minimum of right, and of freedom of action. We stand firm in armed neutrality, since it seems that in no other way can we demonstrate what it is we insist upon and cannot forego."

The President is right. The administration merely insists upon the observance of the principles of international law as they have been known, understood, and recognized for a generation. The President is not demanding any changes in the International code, or suggesting any abbreviations. He is simply demanding exact justice for America and Americans. He is not courting a conflict or inviting attack. He is taking the precaution which any prudent man would take under similar circumstances. If shots are fired, they will not come first from the guns which the President has placed on board the American merchantmen. They will come first from a German submarine. The President is asserting the common law right of self-defense, recognized both among men and nations. If that is illegal, unjust, or unchristian, then the very cornerstone of our governmental machinery has crumbled and decayed.

THE COMMERCIAL CLUB

The proposed merger of the Commercial club and the Albany Retail Merchants Association has the approval of the Democrat. The plan to increase the dues of the members of the combined organizations is, in our judgment, sensible and necessary.

If we are to have an organization of local businessmen we ought to have a good one. We can't have a good organization without adequate financial support and the co-operation of every business and professional man in Albany.

If the financial support and co-operation are forthcoming the Commercial club will prove of inestimable value to those who compose its membership. If we fall down in either, the executive officers will be handicapped in their work and the commercial interests of the city will suffer. The new officials therefore have a right to expect the united support of an undivided community.

Said bonds are to be issued in denominations of \$500.00 each, bearing interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, principle and semi-annual interest payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York, N. Y., and mature at the expiration of ten years from the date thereof.
