Carson "Skeeter" Bigbee, the Ty Cobb of the West, arrived in Portland last night and will leave this morning for the training camp of the Pittsburgh National League ball club at Columbus, Ga.

At winter he and his brother, Lyle, who is one of the Portland club in Honolulu, have been working on their father's ranch near Waterloo, Or.

Bigbee hit 250 in 43 games after reporting to Pittsburgh last fall.

Bigbee is the University of Oregon boy who went south with Walter McCredie last spring and after being switched to Tacoma, of the Northwestern League, was sold for \$5000 by Russ Hill to Owen Barney Dreyfuss, of the Pirates.

Carson Bigbee will be 22 years old this month. Pretty young for a National Leaguer.
