LIMITING SENATE DEBATES

The Senate Rules Committee yesterday agreed upon a cloture rule providing that a two thirds vote can limit the debate to one hour for each member of the Senate.

This is sound sense. Senate debates seldom do more than increase the volume of work for the public printer. Few, if any votes are changed and the fellows back home will be unanimously in favor of an abbreviated congressional record. It saves the time of the Senate and the time of those who desire to keep posted on the proceedings of the Senators.

But there is another and more serious argument in favor of "ruthless" limitation of Senatorial oratory. Under the rules as they exist at the present time it is a rule of the minority. Not one, but many measures of real merit have been "talked" to death during the closing day of the session by a belligerent Senator who held the floor until the hour of adjournment, thereby preventing a vote on a bill which had the approval of more than two thirds of the members. There have been many notable examples of this character and some of the ablest leaders of both parties have resorted to filibustering tactics in order to carry their point.

That a rule of reason and common sense is now to place the rule of the minority should be the matter of congratulation, both to the members of Congress and to the country.

Said bonds are to be issued in denominations of \$500.00 each, bearing interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, principle and semi-annual interest payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York, N.
