WOMEN-SUFFRAGE GAINS

The spectacular methods employed by the proponents of women-suffrage, both in this country and abroad, may perhaps have gained a temporary advantage but in the end proved a decided injury to the cause which it was expected to help.

All of the Pacific coast states together with Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, Utah, Arizona and Kansas were won by an appeal to the reason of the male voters. There was no soap box oratory, no pickets stationed at the doors of the executive mansion, no "hunger strikes", and as far as we have been able to ascertain, no arrests for petty violations of the laws of the state or nation. A dignified campaign was conducted and it was conducted along lines which might properly be expected to appeal to the thinking members of the male sex.

It is in our judgment unfortunate for the cause—and we would not vote to deny the women the ballot—that so many of the suffrage leaders in the western states have not followed the example set by the women of Oregon and her sister states west of the Rocky mountains. They have preferred to imitate some of their wild-eyed English cousins, and in so doing are doing the movement which they serve, a grave and irreparable injury.

There are now fifteen women-suffrage states, casting one hundred and thirty five, out of five hundred and thirty-one electoral votes. These states have a population of twenty-five million people, the great majority of whom were converted to the suffrage movement by a direct appeal to the intellect. British suffrage leaders have tried the melo-drama method of appealing to the voting population and failed. Why should American women imitate them?

sum of Nine Thousand Three Hun-
dred Fifty-two and 51/100 (\$9,352.51)
dollars. Said bonds are to be issued
in denominations of \$500.00 each,
bearing interest at the rate of 6 per
cent per annum, interest payable
semi-annually, principle and semi-annual
interest payable at the Fiscal
Agency of the State of Oregon in New
York, N. Y., and mature at the ex-
