JUSTICE IN PENNSYLVANIA

Harry K. Thaw has been declared insane by a commission in the state of Pennsylvania. The public is to be congratulated upon the fact that this time the petition was filed by his mother and it is therefore assumed that the Thaw millions will no longer be used in protecting a moral pervert simply and solely because he happens to bear the name of an otherwise respectable family.

When Thaw was first tried for the murder of Stanford White many dignified gentlemen who called themselves "alienists" testified that he was insane. The court so found, and he was sent to a hospital maintained by the taxpayers of New York for the purpose of caring for those who are mentally unbalanced.

Said bonds are to be issued in denominations of \$500.00 each, bearing interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, principle and semi-annual interest payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York, N. Y., and mature at the expiration of ten years from the date thereof.

The right to take up and cancel any of these bonds upon the payment of the face value thereof with accrued interest to the date of payment at any semi-annual coupon period at or after one year from the date of such bond or bonds, is reserved by the City of Albany, Oregon, said redemption if so made to be in accordance with Chapter V, Title XXVI of Lord's Oregon Laws.
