A RUSSIAN DEMOCRACY

The most sensational item of news flashed over the wires since the great naval battle off the German coast was that which announced the overthrow of the Czar by the progressive forces which dominate the Russian Duma. In fact it may prove the most sensational and far reaching despatch of the present century. It may be but a prelude to the great International drama which will be enacted upon the other side of the Atlantic and finally result in the overthrow of Monarchy and the establishment of a republican form of government patterned after that of the United States.

The great battle between European democracy and plutocracy has been waged for centuries. In some sections of the world Democracy has consented to a truce but has never surrendered. The same forces which brought the Czar to the feet of his subjects are working in every other country in the world. The same democracy which crowned its efforts with success in Russia will some day rise in the majesty of its power and decree that Germany was created for the Germans and not for the Kaiser.

If the Democracy which now rules Russia tempers its policy with reason and humanity, it will blaze the trail for a new and more democratic European civilization. If it adopts a policy which brings the nation which it proposes to serve into disrepute, it will prove a blow to World Democracy from which it will not recover for a generation.

Democracy is now on trial in Russia. May it live up to the hopes and the expectations of its friends.
