A NEW RUSSIA

What will happen in Russia in the
event that the new republican govern-
ment is successful in maintaining law
and order? This is the question which
the average man is asking since the
publication of the startling news that
Russia has thrown off the yoke of the
Czar and established a democratic
form of government.

Russia in Europe has an area of
1,862,524 square miles or about two-
thirds that of the United States, and
contains a population of 111,279,500.
In Asia it has territory of 2,904,200
square miles, or an area about the size
of the United States, and this has a
population of about 40,000,000. Its
territory comprises more than one-
seventh of the entire territorial sur-
face of the globe. It has a mountain
system that contains vast wealth of
precious metals. It is splendidly
watered, one of its rivers being navi-
gable almost to its source, and it has
16,000 miles of navigable rivers and
lakes. Its mineral wealth produces
yearly large sums of gold, thirty mil-
lion tons of coal, and petroleum and
salt are abundant. It has magnificent
fisheries and besides furnishing its
own people sends a large surplus of
wheat to feed the balance of Europe.

With all of these resources, backed
by an enlightened public opinion and
a form of government which cultiva-
tes, rather than discourages commer-
cial enterprise among its citizens, the
future possibilities of Russia are tremen-
dous.

For generations the Czar and his
subjects have been living in a little
world of their own, the later dream-
ing of a new era of democracy and the
former unconscious of real danger to
his throne.

The dream of the Russian peasants
has at last become a stern reality, and
a new Russia will be born from the
ashes of the past. Whether the new
Russia will become the dominate com-
mercial nation of Europe or continue
to be the international drone of com-
merce depends upon the people
themselves, but the establishment of
a republican form of government is
the greatest stride which that country
has ever taken towards commercial
supremacy.
